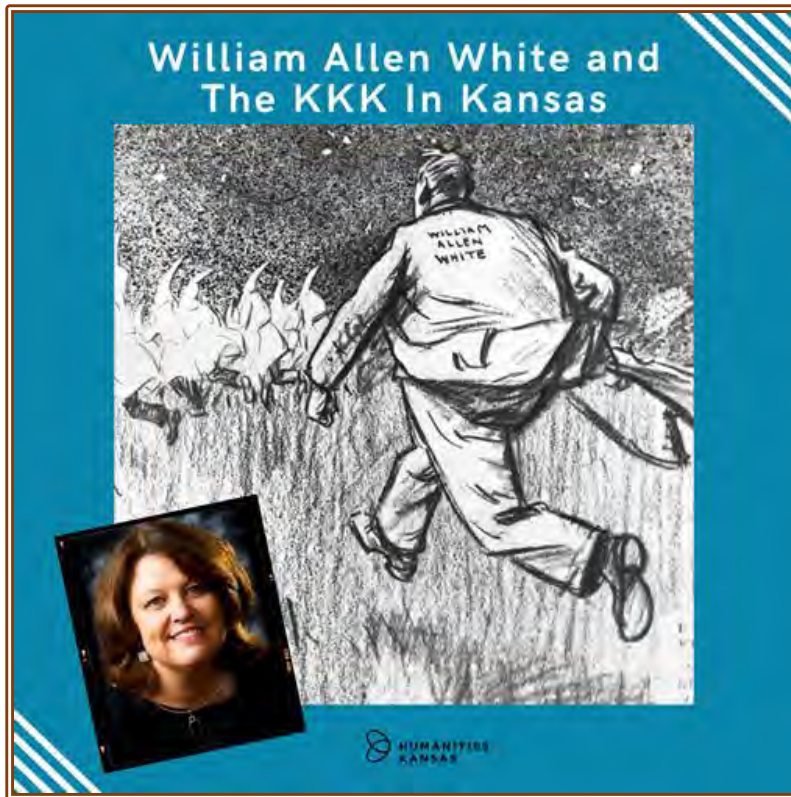




Fourth Tuesday Program

William Allen White and the KKK in Kansas

The Tonganoxie Community Historical Society will host author and educator Beverley Olson Buller for a presentation and discussion exploring William Allen White's resistance against the KKK.

William Allen White wrote in 1922, "When anything is going to happen in this country, it happens first in Kansas." Accordingly, Kansas became the first state in the union to outlaw the Ku Klux Klan. The story of White's role in history is fascinating and one of which his fellow Kansans can be very proud.



"William Allen White and the KKK in Kansas" is part of Humanities Kansas's Speakers Bureau and "21st Century Civics," a collection of resources that invite Kansans to participate in community discussions and learn more about the history of American democracy and the shared responsibilities of citizenship.
