Workshop to Restore the Historic Windows of the Reno Methodist Church

The Reno Methodist Church was built in 1918 to replace the original 1891 structure in Reno, Kansas. The church holds a rich history of Sunday services, marriages, death, ice cream socials and watermelon feeds. In 1993, the congregation could no longer support the church and to save it from being torn down, church members sold the building to the Tonganoxie Community Historical Society and paid the cost of moving it from Reno to Tonganoxie in the spring of 1994.

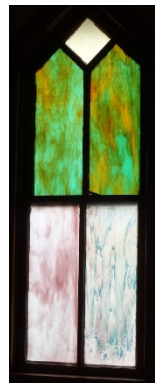


Sign up for a two-day hands-on workshop to restore a window in the Reno Methodist Church, under the supervision and instruction of John Wood, WoodWorks Restoration. John specializes in the restoration of historic windows and doors.



The workshops will take place on a Thursday and Saturday from 10am to 3pm each day.

Each volunteer will remove, restore, and re-install one double-hung window, with guidance and instruction.
