The Kansas City Monarchs in Your Hometown Presented by Phil S. Dixon

Formed in 1920, the Kansas City Monarchs revolutionized baseball: they were charter members of the Negro National League; they were the first professional team to use outdoor lighting; they sent more players to the major leagues than any other Negro League franchise. We will explore the early barnstorming days of the Monarchs and highlight great players such as Wilbur "Bullet" Rogan, Satchel Paige, and Jackie Robinson.



Phil S. Dixon is a co-founder of the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum in Kansas City and the author of nine books about baseball, including biographies about Wilber "Bullet" Rogan and John "Buck" O'Neil.
