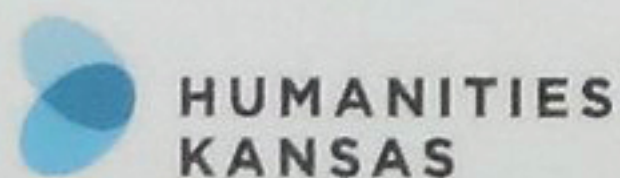




This historic spring served as an essential water source for travelers in the mid-19th century. The extensive use of the spring resulted in a detour added to the Leavenworth-Lawrence Road. Later, the spring's cool, clean water and location contributed to the success of Frank Fairchild's dairy farm.
